The 2025 FaceBase Community Forum will host a poster session on **Tuesday**, **June 3 at the Information Sciences Institute (ISI) in Marina del Rey (Los Angeles, CA)**.

Overview:

- Participation is only available in person.
- Use the registration form to sign up for the poster session and describe your topic.
- You must submit an abstract (DOCX).
- You will be asked to present a "lightning talk" at the beginning of the poster session.
- All poster presenters must provide one slide and a poster PDF.
 - Lightning Slide (PPTX): One slide to be used during your "lightning talk" during the first 30 minutes of the poster session. This talk should be a concise, "elevator pitch" version of your poster.
 - **Poster (PDF):** High-resolution PDF of the poster for remote attendees.
- Presenters must bring their printed posters to the meeting and hang them using provided materials before the poster session..

Important Dates:

- Submit your abstract to <u>this Google Drive</u> by **Friday**, **May 16**. (See abstract requirements below)
- Acceptance notifications will be sent by Friday, May 23.
- Upload your poster PDF and lightning talk slide to this Google Drive by Friday, May 30.
- Poster Session is on Tuesday, June 3 at 3:20 pm PDT.

Topics

- We encourage submissions of clinical/translational cases, ML/Al and training scenarios as well as basic science.
- Scientific progress or accomplishments that advance <u>FaceBase aims</u>.
- Demonstration of how FaceBase data is used or reused for new scientific insights.

Abstract requirements:

- Submit using a Word doc (DOCX format, although we will also accept DOC).
- Exclude figures, tables, or a reference list.
- Limit the abstract **title** to 10 words.
- The abstract **body** should not exceed 250 words.
- Use the abstract template at this link.

Poster details:

- POSTER PREPARATION: Your research mentor is the best source of information on how to prepare your poster. We suggest a poster size of 36" x 48" in landscape orientation (this is standard for many professional conferences). There is also a wealth of information on scientific poster presentations online.
