

FaceBase 2023 Poster Session

The 2023 FaceBase Community Forum will host poster sessions on **Tuesday, June 13th at the Health Sciences Campus Conference Center Ballroom, University of Southern California in Los Angeles**. This year, the poster session will be available both in-person and remotely.

Format Overview:

- Both in-person and remote participation.
- Poster presenters must provide two videos and a poster PDF.
 - "Lightning talk" video: A one-minute overview of the poster. **This should function as an "advertisement and be able to be publicly posted.**
 - Longer presentation video: A three-minute in-depth presentation.
 - Poster PDF: High-resolution PDF of the poster for remote attendees.
- In-person presenters should bring printed posters and hang them using provided materials.
- Poster presenters can indicate whether they approve public viewing of their poster.

Important Dates:

- Submit your abstract via the meeting registration form by **Wed, May 31**.
- Acceptance notifications will be sent by **Mon, June 5**.
- Upload your digital presentation files (videos and PDF) by **Thurs, June 9**.
- Poster Session is on Tuesday, June 13th at 8:00 pm EDT/5:00 pm PDT.

Abstract requirements:

- Exclude figures, tables, or a reference list.
- Limit the title length to 10 words.
- The abstract body should not exceed 250 words.
- Use the provided abstract template.

Instructions for all poster presenters:

- Upload a PDF of your poster and two videos: 1 minute "lightning talk" for public consumption and 3 minute in-depth video..

- This allows remote attendees to access all posters.
- Your poster videos should be concise, focused on the "take home" message, and display your contact information.
- Upload your videos and poster ahead of the meeting by Thurs, June 9th.
- Indicate whether you are willing to share your poster publicly (not just the lightning talk).

In-person poster details:

- POSTER PREPARATION: Your research mentor is the best source of information on how to prepare your poster. We suggest a poster size of 36" x 48" in landscape orientation (this is standard for many professional conferences). The maximum dimensions are 48" x 96". There is also a wealth of information on scientific poster presentations online. Here are a few places to start:

- Set up posters in the designated room at the meeting venue between 4:45 pm and 5:00 pm PDT.
- The poster session will start at 5:00 pm PDT.
- Materials for displaying posters will be provided.
- Upload your poster PDF and videos to the provided Google Drive by Thurs, June 9.

Remote poster details:

- Your poster video should be a pre-recorded presentation.
- Video length and logistics will be announced by Wed, June 1.
- Make the video succinct and focused on the "take home" message, prominently displaying your contact information.
- Upload your videos and poster ahead of the meeting by Thurs, June 9th.
- Indicate whether you are willing to share your poster materials publicly.
